#### Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

to an audience. Within English, the children have thoroughly enjoyed created their very own 'Nen and the Lonely Fisherman' themed stories; they have been a joy to read in the classroom together. Within maths, the children have developed their understanding of decimals even further and applied their understanding to some tricky problem solving tasks. #### Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

What a jam-packed four days we have had in Ash. The children have completed their Mars rover explanations using the book Curiosity as their inspiration. The children have designed their own Victorian-inspired cam toy, made the wooden frame themselves as well as the cam mechanism. They then evaluated the process at the end-saying what went well and what they would improve next time.
