What a great first half term we have had in Oak Class! It has been lovely to get to know our class through our topic of 'My World' and to explore the world around us as we move into Autumn. This week we went on a welly walk with Cedar Class to look for seasonal changes in our local area. In English, we have been reading 'The Squirrels who Squabbled' together and enjoyed giving the squirrels advice on how to be a good friend. Through our Autumn topic, we have created leaf wreaths, pumpkin collages and made nests for the animals in our outside area. We have loved being outside in our outdoor area with Willow Class as we investigate the digging area, cook marvellous muddy meals and practice our obstacle courses together.



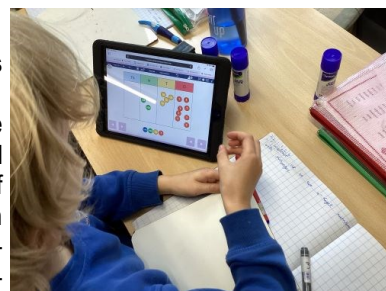
Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

Cedar have had a fantastically autumnal week this week! We observed the beginnings of lots of changes in our local area on our welly walk on Monday and predicted how it will look in a few weeks' time too. This was also a lovely way to end our geography unit as we could see lots of human and physical features that we've spoken about over this half term. In English, we've been developing our vocabulary by thinking creatively about how to describe autumn treasures, drawing on our science knowledge too, ready to create our own acrostic poems about Autumn.



Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a wonderful last two weeks of school. Within English, the children have enjoyed learning from our text 'Tara Beach' and as a result have written some fabulous scripts. Within maths, the children have been taught how to exchange both in addition and subtraction calculations. Finally, the children did themselves proud at the cross country event showing determination and resilience in abundance. Have a great break.



Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Over the past two weeks we have been completing many of our topics: we have finished off our work on the 'Windrush Child' by writing a persuasive piece of writing about erecting a new monument; we have completed our printing project in art - as well as creating entries for our MPs Christmas Card Competition; and we have capped off our geography unit on ocean currents with a quiz! The children have also really enjoyed building their knowledge on Islam - with a focus on what each of the five pillars mean. In PE, children from Ash competed in the Killerton Cross Country event with the rest taking part in tag rugby related games. In maths, we have progressed onto looking at multiplication and division as well as multiples, factors, and prime, square and cube numbers.
