Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

It has been lovely to have our Cedar Class family back together this week and to hear some of the adventures they have been getting up to over the holidays! In English, we have jumped straight back



in with our new story about a piano playing bear and in maths we have been continuing to master our skills in addition and subtraction. The children are discovering that art comes in many forms and have begun exploring ideas in their sketchbooks. In RE, we have heard the story of the 'Lost Son' and will continue to learn about other parables in the coming weeks to help us understand what Christians believe God is like. A super start to the Spring Term!

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have returned to school exceptionally well. The children have been lucky enough to have had some specialist training from an Exeter Chiefs coach this week during which they dis-



played fantastic resilience and determination. Within English, the children have begun to discover our new text "The Pied Piper of Hamlin' and thoroughly enjoyed imagining a rat had appeared within the class! In maths, the children are continuing to work hard on developing their multiplication and division knowledge.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

We welcomed the new year back by getting straight into our new book in English called 'The Promise'. This book is a narrative which looks at the issue of improving the environment and the positive changes it brings. In our PSHE session, we looked at the pressures and impact of smoking. If the children have any questions which develop from these sessions, please encourage them to discuss them in school or at home. In maths, we have been completing our unit on multiplication and division - looking at how we can use known facts to answer increasingly difficult questions. In RE, our focus has switched to Judaism and the importance of the Torah. Finally, we had our first session delivered by the Exeter Chiefs and half of the class have begun swimming this term. We have also completed our Rainbow Spelling assessments, so please ask the children about which spellings they are working

on as they should be bringing them home. Homework tasks will begin from now so please ensure that they are completing their tasks by Thursday evening.
