Willow Class (Pre-school)

Over the last couple of weeks we have been exploring our new topic of celebrations. We've been looking at the different types of celebrations and what they mean. The children have been exploring and counting numbers in different ways and with different objects. We had a visit from the community police officers



who explained how they keep us safe and let us look in their van. It was great fun!

Oak Class (Reception)

It has been an exciting few weeks full of visitors in school and we have loved learning from new people. Our first visitor was Football Freestyler Jamie Knight, who taught us many new tricks for us to practice together and the importance of being resilient towards a challenge. We were also lucky enough to have a visit from a local police officer and to learn about all of the important things that the police do to help us. In our provision, we have enjoyed dressing up in different costumes for people who help us and talking about what we want to be when we grow up. To link in with our Celebrations topic, we have discovered more about traditions for Diwali and created Rangoli artwork using bright colours. The week ended with some

snowy magic and we have had a fantastic time learning about ice, snowy climates and what happens to snow when it melts.



Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

Last week, we had a fun-filled Friday with Children in Need and Jamie Knight's football session. Then on Tuesday, we took part in 20 different activi-



ties with Uffculme's sports leaders. In amongst all that, we've been looking at partitioning numbers to 100, planning and writing stories, learning about transport long ago, starting our lanterns and thinking about what faith means.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a fantastic coupe of weeks at school. The children thoroughly enjoyed meeting our special visitor this week whereby they were introduced to the world of free style football



and had the rare opportunity of learning some exciting new skills. Within maths, the children have been making connections across their times tables and how they can use them to find at answers for unknown facts. On the same day, the netball and basketball teams were really successful at the Uffculme sports events. We also had the Freestyle Football guest in on the Friday which really inspired the children. In class, we are deep into our new book 'The Invention of Hugo Cabret' so the children are looking at writing in different styles and predicting the story as we go. In maths, we have been learning about adding and subtracting numbers and we have also been working on areas of arithmetic to improve. In history, we

are learning about what Sampford Peverell was like in the past by looking at a variety of maps which show when the roads, canals and trains came to the area.
