Following our Geography input focusing on cities, towns or villages,

In Ash, the children have had a busy couple of weeks with visitors and events a-plenty! We also had really positive comments from the visitors from the NSPCC who gave a talk to the children about speaking out and staying safe. In English, we have completed our writing of a biography about Phillipe Petit - The Man Who Walked Between The Towers. In maths we have moved on from place value onto addition and subtraction - with the children investigating when we should and shouldn't use certain methods. We have also been preparing for har-

vest by writing a range of poetry and we have also deepened our understanding of freshwater aquatic biomes in Devon and around the world.
