ce Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2) e you What a brilliant start to this half term! We've been busy taking care of our very special pebbles - describing please them, thanking them and designing cosy places for them - just like the main of



them - just like the main character in our new story 'Lubna and Pebble'. Cedar have wowed Mrs Holland and Mrs Wakefield with their 3D shape knowledge and we've been busy investigating their properties. History this week was a one-off session learning about what life was like in WW1, which also linked to our art this week. We heard from Mr Bishop that *his* grandad remembered seeing bombs being dropped out of German zeppelin's over London although he didn't know what they were at the time. This was in preparation for our visit from the historical society and Remembrance Service today.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a marvellous first week back at school jumping straight back into our school routines. Within P.E, the children have started to develop synchronised movements to beat and thoroughly enjoyed it. Within English, our WW1 mini topic has given the children an insight into what life might have been like on



the front line as well as the important role of women. Further to this, they also learnt about some of the amazing accomplishments of animals during WW1 too. In all a great first week back!

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week we have been starting off the new half term by focussing on a mini-history topic on World War One to link in with Armistice Day on the 11/11/24. We have been looking at the history of the war and how and why it started. Today, we had the local historical society in (Clive and Peter) to deepen our understanding of the roles of local people from Sampford Peverell. We also looked at some famous WWI poetry which inspired the children to write their own poems about the conflict in a variety of forms. In art, Miss Keary has helped the children create some wonderful poppies to display in the garden and children from our class have also been helping to sell poppies for the British Legion. In maths, we have begun our unit on fractions - looking at equivalent fractions. In PE, we have begun our dance unit on prejudice and discrimination which links well with our previous work on

Black History Month and an upcoming text on the Suffragettes. In RE, we are also diving deeper into the story of Moses which links brilliantly with the Open the Books team's stories this term.
