Beech Class have had a jam-packed two weeks at school full of Christmas festivities. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about pneumatics and creating their own Christmas



themed toy. They have also enjoyed their Christmas crafts day as well as baking their own mince pies. Have a wonderful break and we look forward to seeing you in the new year!

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Over the past two weeks, we have been completing our topic across all subjects. The children wrote some fantastic page presentations on the Suffragettes (you can access these at home through their Office 365 accounts) showing their knowledge of the subject. We also completed our dance routines on out prejudice and discrimination them by linking them to the Suffragettes too. In maths, we have been extending our knowledge on multiplication and division and in science we capped of our science topic with a great session looking at inherited traits in family photos. We also created some 'Father Christmas Detection Devices' using their circuit knowledge from science to design, make and evaluate a pressure switch to detect the movement of Father Christmas. We also completed

our cookery activity for the term by creating some festive mince pies where the children independently followed the recipe, weighed the ingredients and combined it all; they also created a video of the activity for their computing unit!
