Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody. Our first full week has been really

great with lots of opportunities and experiences for our new and returning children to start and continue there EYFS journey, with us. Our topic is "My World" which gives lots of



play and learning experiences to discover all about each other. We are learning our nursery routines and transitions and building friendships, independence and resilience through play-based learning experiences. A big hello and welcome to you all. Have a lovely weekend.

Oak Class (Reception)

We have had a fantastic week in Oak Class and the children have made a brilliant start to Reception! Our topic for this term is 'My World' and we have enjoyed getting to know each other well. It has been a very busy week as we explored our classroom and spent time in Willow Class too. Some of our favourite activities have been big group games on the field with Willow Class, drawing self-portraits and creating glittery

potions in our sandy tuff trays. We have begun our Phonics learning journey this week and have loved playing Fred Games together. In our PE session this week, we became witches and wizards as we created a big potion in the hall! We are so excited for the year ahead in Oak Class.



Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

What a brilliant start to their time in Year 1/2! Cedar class came in on Monday to find the garden in a right mess! There were plenty of clues as to what it might have been and our predictions were confirmed



when we began our new book, 'Billy and the Beast'. In maths, we've been wowing Mrs Holland & Mrs Wakefield with our understanding of numbers within 20. During the afternoons, we've been exploring and discussing friendships (including what to do when things aren't going well), jealousy, spirituality and the British Values.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a wonderful week at school after the summer holidays. The Children have spent time practicing and remembering all the school routines as well as the importance of our school val-



ues. Within Maths, the children have begun to develop an understanding of place value and enjoyed getting hands on with lots of resources to support their learning. Within English, the children have been emersed into the fictional picture book 'Varmints' and are beginning to understand the relevance of the narrative in connection to our modern world. The children have also begun to learn new skills within our tag rugby sessions as well as learning a range of instruments in Spanish.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

It has been great to welcome back the children this term and we are really excited about the year ahead. Our main focus since returning from the summer holidays, has been to transition into the new school year as smoothly as possible. This has meant that we have had a heavy focus on our PSHE session: looking at class expectations; setting personal goals for the year; thinking about the roles and responsibilities of being in Ash Class; as well as looking at how we deal with emotions in a positive manner. We have also started our new unit in RE which is all about Muslim in Britain and the children have already thought of some great questions to kick us off. We have also started our English sessions; we are looking at a book called 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan and the children have been analysing the book and doing some deep thinking about the meaning. In maths we are starting the
