Willow Class (Pre-school)

This week Willow have been exploring the colours of different types of weather and have been developing their counting skills by using songs to support their understanding of counting-why not practise these songs at home by clicking here. Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

It has been another busy fortnight in Oak Class as we continue to explore our Wonderful Weather topic. In art, we are exploring clay and worked to roll, squash and shape our clay into different weather symbols. We marked Earth Day by discussing our favourite outside places, doing a litter pick and making a poster as a class to increase awareness for looking after our planet. In geography, we are learning about climate and enjoyed looking at weather forecasts from all over the

world. Through provision, the children have created collage raindrops, designed dragons and practiced their sorting skills in our new digging space. Our book in English is 'George and the Dragon'; we have loved using exciting adjectives to describe the gigantic, fiery dragon!



Cedar Class (Year 2)

Cedar Class have been busy writing their own fantasy stories based on 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey this week, with a focus on describing characters and set-



tings. We're into our final week of fractions and have looked at finding 3/4 of shapes and amounts. During art, we've been developing our clay skills by creating pinch pots and imprinting patterns into clay tiles. PE lessons are all about target games this half term and we've had fun using the tri-golf equipment in a mini golf course on the playground. It took a lot less force to get the balls to the targets than we thought!

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a fantastic couple of weeks at school. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the Mysteries of Harris Burdick and exploring imaginative fanta-



sy narratives. Within maths, the children have further developed their understanding of time and enjoyed solving many mathematical problems. Finally, the children have also begun to learn the basics of tennis: learning both racket and ball control.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

The last two weeks have, once again, been jam-packed with learning and events! We have now finished our writing block on Kaspar with the children completing their very own newspaper articles about the sinking of the Titanic. The children have also completed their shape unit in maths - investigating 2D and 3D shapes and their properties - including their internal angles. In art, the children absolutely loved their session on 3D sculpture making a piece meaningful to them out of odd/scrap materials. Most of the Year 5 children will be returning from their London residential which has been absolutely brilliant (check out the photos on the school website).
