It has been a fantastic half term in Oak Class exploring Wonderful Weather and Spring. In the last week, we have celebrated World Bee Day by learning lots of fascinating facts about bees and completing lots of bee crafts. We were extremely lucky to be able to see the carving of the ash tree stump in our Outdoor Area and watch it be transformed into an owl! Over the half term we have been exploring clay and have finished designing and shaping clay tile hous-

es. In Science, we have been experimenting with flowers to learn what they need to grow and about the different parts of a flower. We are really looking forward to our topic 'Come Outside' in the final term where we will be exploring nature in our area.

For science, we've been busy planting to investigate what plants need to grow and survive. Each day, we're taking care of our own sunflower seeds and deciding what we need to do to help them thrive!

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have had a fabulous week at school enjoying a range of learning experiences. Within English, the children have been busy writing a biography about Howard Carter and exploring how his early life led to his intrigue in the Egyptians. The children have also enjoyed putting their tennis skills to use within our last ses-



sion, where they practiced their technique. Finally, the children were hands on in their final art lesson this week, working hard to create their final 3D sculptures.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week the children have been busy creating their own murder mystery stories based on 'High Rise Mystery' by Sharna Jackson. The have been experimenting with how sentences are formed for effect. In maths, we have been investigating 3D shapes, how they are formed from nets and whether certain nets work or not. This week has also seen children in Ash participate in the Wilcombe Wobbler and a girls' football tournament at Uffculme (winning 4 out of 7 games). The children have also completed their 3D personal sculptures - using a range of techniques. We have also read through the script for the upcoming KS2 production: The Wind in the Willows so the children are now able to bring their scripts home. We have not had time to audition this week, so that will happen after half term so they can get choosing which roles they might like. On Friday, we had our Rainbow Day activities - discussing how stereotypes work and how we need to find

our own individual liberty. Now we look forward to our half term break and all the great things coming up before the end of the year!
